Things To Think About

WHEN CHOOSING YOUR COLLEGE/UNIVERSITY

- **Majors/Minors Available**

- check to see which colleges offer the majors and minors you're interested in.
- any double majors or other unique programs available?

- **Cost of Attendance**

- consider the cost of the college or university and your financial aid.
- which colleges have offered you scholarships?

- **Location & Size**

- what's the climate like: hot or cold?
- what is the size of the school?
- is it close to your family/friends or far away?
- how close is transportation to get home (airports, train stations, bus stations, etc.)?

- **Facilities On-Campus**

- Think about the dining halls, residence halls, recreation opportunities, and services like medical care available on/near campus.

- **Extracurricular Activities Available**

- what sports, clubs, etc do they offer?

- **How Do You Feel On Campus?**

- do you feel comfortable on campus?
- do the spaces where you'll eat, sleep, study, and hang out feel good to you?
